



Cleaning Textilene.*

Cleaning Textilene periodically will prevent mold and mildew growth and make it last for longer.

1. Mix one cup of mild household bleach in three gallons of water.
2. Apply this to the fabric areas and then rinse thoroughly with clean water.
3. If stained, treat your textilene fabrics as soon as possible to prevent the stains from setting in.

If attacked by mildew?*

Although textilene is mildew resistant, it's not mildew proof. If mildew forms ...

1. Mix three cups of mild household bleach with a bucket of clean water.
2. Soak the infected area completely and allow excess to run off as much as possible
3. Allow the cushions to dry in the sun or a warm environment for several hours to activate the bleach, thus killing the mildew.
4. Once again, rinse the cushions thoroughly and allow them to dry completely.

Preparing Textilene Fabrics for storage.*

At the end of summer you may get ready to put away your textilene fabrics. Before doing so, wipe the fabric down with a watered-down solution of liquid pine cleaner. Rinse thoroughly. Once the fabric has completely dried it is ready to store.

Storing Textilene Fabrics.*

Avoid storing textilene fabrics in spaces such as attics or basements or outdoor units that are not suitably insulated against mold, mildew, insects and other threats. The best storage location is a cool, dry room/shed/garage with sufficient air circulation.
